



## Winding Trails Overnight Camping General Information and Rules

- Sites:** There are 5 overnight campsites on property. They are intended for tent camping only and are “pack in/pack out”. This means no cars are allowed at the sites or on the trails.
- Fees:** Cost for a campsite is \$15 per member family per night. Guests of members are welcome at a cost of \$25 per family. Each site is limited to a maximum of two families or eight people per site.
- Reservations:** All sites require a reservation, payment, and signed contract. Contact Bailey Dailey, Recreation Coordinator at (860) 677-8458 x11 or [bailey@windingtrails.org](mailto:bailey@windingtrails.org)
- Vehicles:** All vehicles should be parked in a designated parking lot with the provided overnight park pass visible on the dash.
- Hours:** Arrival time on Fridays is 5:00pm and 12:00 noon on Saturdays.  
Departure time is 11:00am on Saturdays and 3:00pm on Sundays.
- Amenities:** Each campsite has a picnic table and fireplace with grill. You need to provide your own charcoal and water. There is a full service bathhouse located behind Garmany Hall with changing areas, flush toilets and showers. Port-o-lets are also located closer to the campsites.
- Campfires:** Campfire rings are available at each site. Wood for the sites should be collected from downed deadwood located around the woods. Families are encouraged to bring an axe for splitting. Please do not help yourself to split wood across from our Maintenance Dept. Campfires should never be left unattended and need to be fully extinguished before leaving your campsite.
- Quiet Time:** Quiet hours are 10:00pm to 8:00am. Please be considerate of others.
- Pet Policy:** Winding Trails does not allow pets on the property at any time.
- Gate:** The Winding Trails main gate is locked promptly at 8:00pm. If you need to leave after that hour for whatever reason we suggest leaving a car outside the gate.
- Wildlife:** Winding Trails has a number of wild animals that live on property. This includes skunks, raccoons, deer, and the occasional bear. All food should be stored in the secure food box and not in your tent.
- Emergency:** In case of any emergency call 911 or contact the Park Director at the residence house on property.
