Camp Nurse

Minimum Qualifications:

- Previous experience as a school or camp nurse and RN license.
- Desire and ability to work with children and adults in a camp setting.
- Enthusiasm, sense of humor, patience, and self-control.
- At least 21 years of age.

Job Description: Under the direction of the Camp Director and Assistant Camp Director, the Camp Nurse is responsible for daily contact, support and guidance in the area of camp healthcare.

Typical Responsibilities and Duties:

- Uphold all policies and philosophies of Winding Trails.
- During staff training, help train staff as to their responsibilities and duties for camper healthcare.
- Work with staff and campers to foster a healthy team oriented camp experience.
- Stay up to date on current CT Department of Health policies and procedures.
- Read through campers and staff medical forms prior to camp season to make sure appropriate staff are made aware of health issues and proper medication and forms are available at camp.
- Review inventory pre-season and maintain medical supplies and inventory during camp season.
- Treat campers and staff for any first-aid needs while at camp based upon the Standing Orders from the camp doctor.
- Communicate and follow up with camper parents and staff after first aid is given with the treatment or care given.
- Have daily communication with all counselors on an individual basis to address any healthcare issues.
- Inform Camp Director and Assistant Camp Director about staff concerns for actions that put the health and safety of the campers at risk.
- Keep accurate records of Health visits to nurse's station.
- Weekly visitation with Camp Doctor to sign Health log and discuss any issues.
- Make recommendations to Camp Director for Health policies and procedures.
- These are not all the duties to be performed. Some duties may be reassigned and other duties may be assigned as required.

Essential Functions:

- Ability to communicate and work with individuals and provide necessary instruction to campers and staff.
- Ability to work in a fast pace ever changing environment and be able to juggle multiple tasks.
- Visual and auditory ability to identify and respond to environmental and other hazards related to camp activity
